



The Gospel passage today contains two distinct accounts, both of which show that awareness of how much debt God has forgiven leads to a great love on the part of the one who has been forgiven.

The first account is about a woman who washes Jesus' feet with her tears, dries them with her hair, and then anoints them with oil while Jesus is eating at the home of Simon, a Pharisee (Luke 7:36-50). The woman has a reputation for being a sinner, and so Simon doubts that Jesus can be a prophet or he would have known "what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner: (7:39).

Jesus tells Simon a parable about a creditor who forgives two debtors who owed, respectively, five hundred and fifty days' wages. In response to Jesus' question as to who will love the creditor more, Simon correctly responds that it is the one who owed him more. From this, Jesus draws the conclusion that this woman must have had her sins forgiven because she has done the courteous acts of washing, drying, and anointing Jesus' feet, acts which Simon had not done (7:40-47).

The second account is a brief note on those who accompanied Jesus. It ends with, and so highlights, many women whom Jesus had healed and who responded generously by providing for Jesus and the apostles out of their resources (8:1-3).

Luke's message at this point of his Gospel is that all have been forgiven much, although some think that they have only little that needs to be forgiven (7:47). The idea of forgiveness takes them out of a deep hole in which they find themselves because of their former actions. Those who realize how much they have been forgiven and what a great burden this forgiveness has lifted from their shoulders will respond with a greater love.

## RESPECT LIFE

**Father, Mother & Family...** The child then must be understood as the maximum expression of the communion between man and woman, the reciprocal acceptance and donation that is realized and transcended in a "third" who is that child. The child is God's blessing. He transforms husband and wife into father and mother. Both "go out from themselves" and express themselves beyond themselves in a person, the very fruit of their love.

In a special way the ideal expressed in Jesus' priestly prayer can be applied to the family. In this prayer he asks that his unity with the Father involve the disciples (Jn 17:11) and those who believe in their word (Jn 17:20-21). The Christian family as "domestic Church", is called to realize this ideal of perfect communion in a special way."
